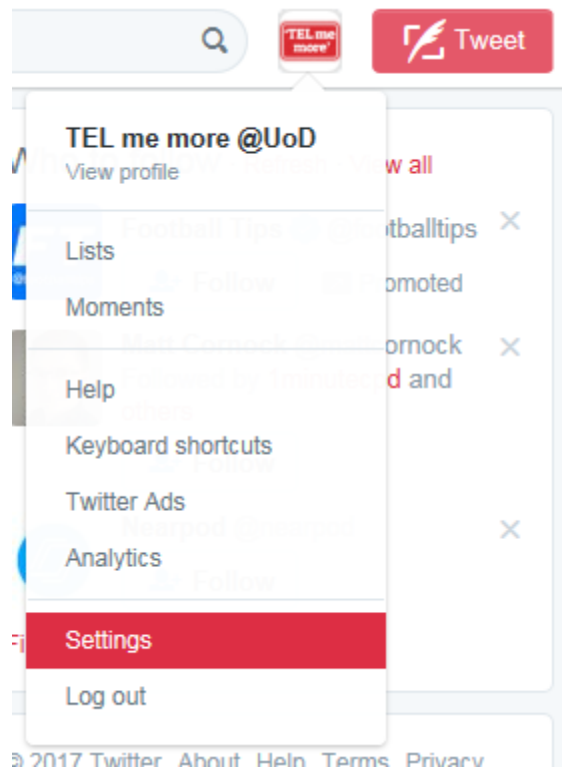


Adding a Twitter feed to Course Resources

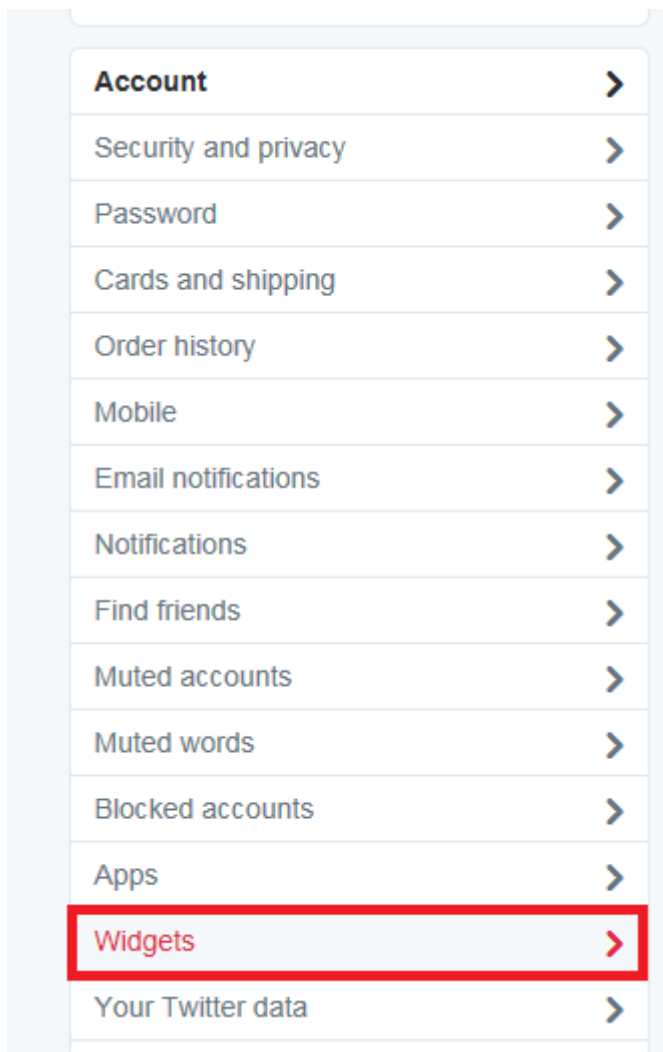

Create Twitter Widget

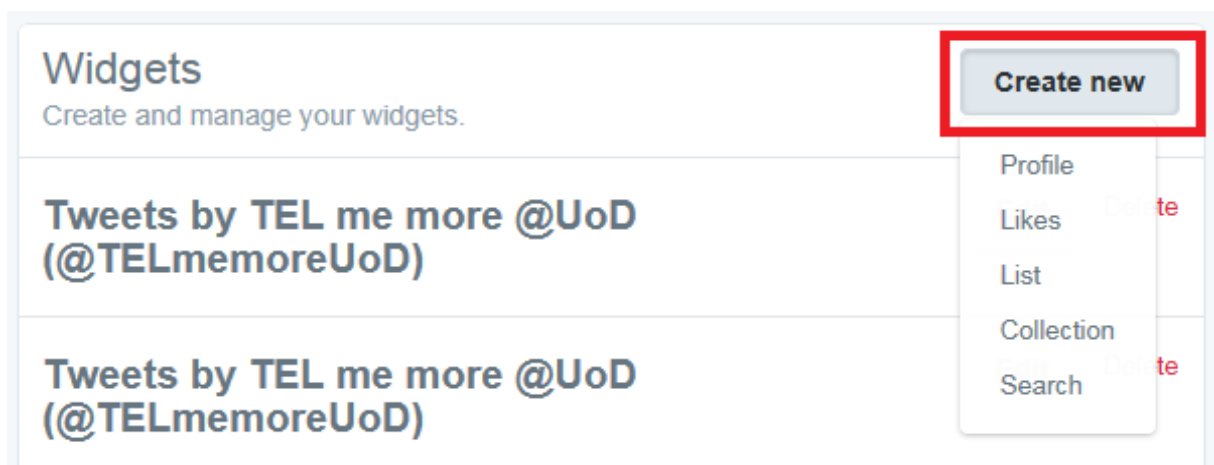
Log on to your Twitter account and go to your account settings.



Under **Account**, select the **Widgets** option.



Select **Create new** to create a widget.



You will have a choice of options, popular options might be **Search** to use with a hashtag (e.g. a module code), or **Profile** to link back to you own Twitter profile.

Type your search query including the hashtag and customise the various options. Click **Save Changes** to see what the final feed will look like.

Once you are happy with your set up, click in the box on the right hand side and **right click** the code with your mouse, then select **Copy**.

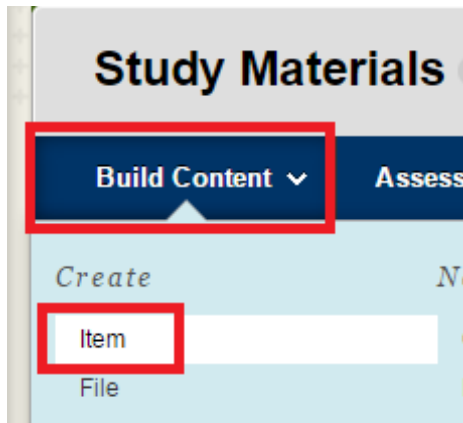

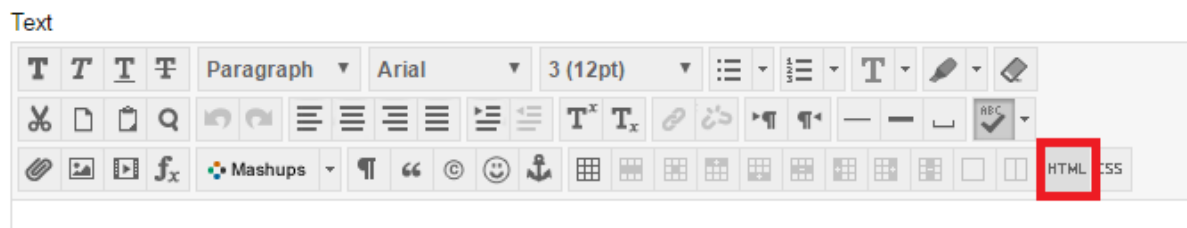
Add Widget code to your module

Go into your module in Course Resources, and find the content area you'd like to add the Twitter feed (e.g. study materials).

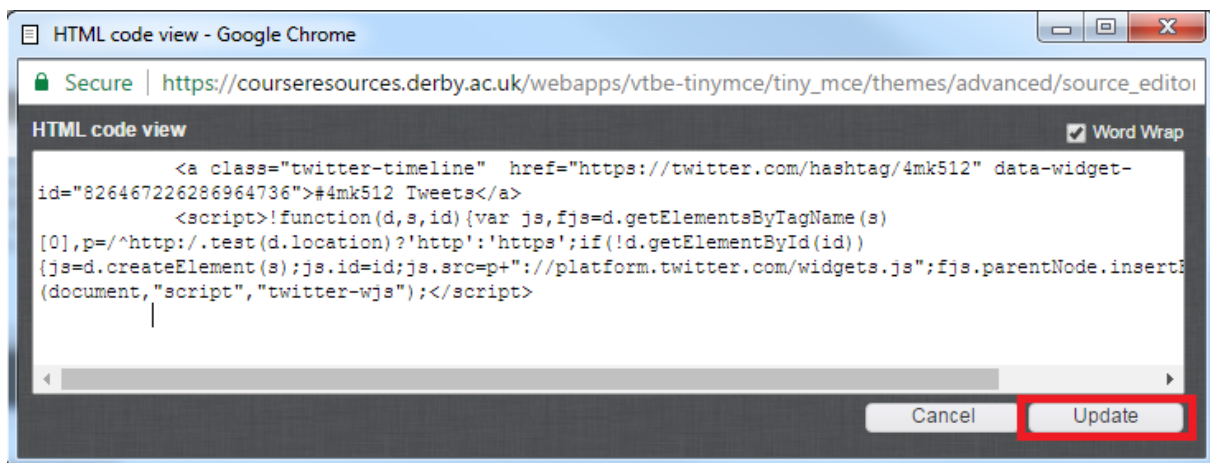
Select **Build Content**, and then **Item**



Enter a name for the item as usual, and then in the content editor select the **HTML** icon



A new window will open. **Right click** in the window to paste in the code from Twitter. It should look like this:



Click **Update** to insert the code into the item.

Select other options as required for the Item and then click **Submit**.
